Coordinator Article

Welcome to another year of Home Education!

If this is your first year, you are in for a ride. Home Education is a very demanding job, but the rewards are completely worth it. For those of you who have been in the trenches for a while, you know that even the most experienced parent sometimes feels like giving up and throwing in the towel. Remember, every morning is a new start, so hang on and find the joy in what you do.

Here are just a few helpful tips:

Routine is a very good thing in home education. Posting schedules on the fridge and making sure all kids know what is expected of them each day.

Physical work is also very important for the developing the character of the child. Give them chores during school time (between subjects) such as changing over the laundry, 5 minutes of weeding the garden or sweeping the porch. Make sure to give your active boys some recess time to run around and get the wiggles out of them.

Reading aloud to your kids is foundational. It gives kids of all ages a love of reading, which is the foundation of education. Once a child can read, he can educate himself on any topic, as long as there is a book on that topic.

Have a plan – daily, weekly, monthly, and/or semesterly (is that a word?). This job takes investment of time, and the more you put in, the more you get out. Don't be afraid to switch curriculum if it isn't working. I don't think any of our kids have used the same math program as any other child in the family.

Minimize screen time. Our kids get 1 hour a day of 'fun' computer time, and we have no TV. If my child tells me they are bored, I have them pull weeds, clean the van, stack firewood, or sweep the porch. They never come back a second time with the word 'bored'. They have bikes, trampolines, a tree house with swing, zip line, legos, and the older kids have their projects and hobbies, such as knife-making, computer-building, or reading.

Having trouble with something? **Ask for help.** We have a mentoring program of certain individuals who would be glad to advise you, or you can post a question to the Google Group or the Forum where the whole group is able to give you guidance. We're all here to help and encourage one another and somebody in our group has already been where you are now, and struggled through what you may be struggling with now.
