Humility

Last month's 'word of the month' for Mascoutah public schools was 'self-esteem.' I'm not sure what exactly their definition of that term was, but I would guess it's the opposite of HSLDA's character trait of the month – 'humility.'

But can we really blame them? After all, many kids today struggle with depression and the suicide rate is very high. Should not some effort be made to help the kids? Certainly, but the ways of the Lord are always better than mans ways. Here are a few verses:

"God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble." - James 4:6

"Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and everyone who humbles himself will be exalted." - Luke 14:11

"What does the Lord require of you? To act justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God." - Micah 6:8

"Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility consider others as better than yourselves..." - Phil. 2:3

So how does this work? If we have a problem with suicide and depression, will not further humility only add to the problem?

Certainly not. "Lean not upon your own understanding" but trust in the Lord, for his ways are sure. We must have a binary approach to this matter. In our relationships with others, with ourselves, and with God we must behave humbly. But at the same time we should consider the awesomeness of the universe and realize that God is so amazingly powerful that he created it all in a moment with a spoken word--- yet God loves us so much (even though we are rotten sinners) that he came down to rescue us from our sin to be his precious children. So in one sense we must behave as if others are better than us, and in the other sense know that God himself loves us and calls us his children.

Our esteem, therefore, should not be 'self-esteem' but rather 'God-esteem', who considered us worthy because of the worth He put into us. The worth that is now in us is of more value than anything in the universe. We are children of God!

Not only that, but God will glorify us, perfect us, and allow us to dwell with Him forever. Here's an amazing verse: (KJV - it's so much prettier)

"Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is." 1 John 3:2

"We shall be like him...." I hope you ponder that part. We shall be like God himself! That was the proud desire of Satan, who boasted that "he would be like the most high" yet was thrown down in his pride.

But God gives us the right to 'be like the most high' if we are humble and follow Christ.

But not yet. Our exaltation will not happen during our lives. We must wait for it patiently and humbly.

In the meantime live humbly. Be open to the wisdom of other Godly people who may know more than you, and think of yourselves as a servant of your fellow man, seeking ways to be a blessing to others.
